## DOPE FOR SOME, DEPORTATION FOR OTHERS?!

Currently, Josefstädter Straße, Thaliastraße and their neighbourhoods are at the center of public attention. Dealers and people of colour are being harrassed there every day. Newly established neighborhood watch groups are agitating against dealers and a green party's borough mayor wants to protect 'his' local residents from a supposed threat.

## Solidarity with the dealers!

Asylum seekers are not allowed to do wage labor in Austria. Those with no access to the labor market have no opportunities to earn money legally. They have to find other ways to make their living. As long as there is a demand for cannabis, cocaine and co. there will be people in desperate situations taking the risk to serve this market.

African dealers on the streets carry the biggest risk in drug business. They earn the least, they experience racist discrimination, and they are constantly under the threat of being caught and deported. In exchange there is cheap weed for everyone in the gentrified 16th district. Is that fair trade?

Not only the Austrian asylum laws, but also the drug laws are constantly being tightened. All those who do not fit into the ideal picture are ousted from public urban space and criminalized. Dealers\* and sex workers\* are the ones hit especially hard by this process. But also all those others, who can not afford the expensive beer at Rhiz or Chelsea, who look different, speak differently or are just young, are driven out systematically.
